

Senate Bill #95-05
April 3, 1995

- TITLE:** Opposition of PAG Funding to Graduate Students Who are Classified Under "Continuous Registration".
- WHEREAS:** The intent of the Professional Advancement Grant (PAG) is to encourage opportunities for graduate students beyond those required for completion of one's program of study (POS), and
- WHEREAS:** There have been requests by graduate students to receive PAG funds are currently enrolled under "continuous registration", and
- WHEREAS:** The official ISU Graduate College Handbook for faculty and students designates those graduate students who have finished their respective course work, passed their preliminary examination, and are not utilizing university equipment, and staff time as "continuously registered" (p. 18; 94-95 Graduate College Handbook), and
- WHEREAS:** Tuition and fees for "continuous registration" graduate students are currently \$70 per semester and \$1360.50 (excluding special college and departmental fees) for "general registration" graduate students, and
- WHEREAS:** There are only a limited amount of funds available for PAG travel and research, and
- WHEREAS:** The PAG monies are allocated from the GSS budget, which in turn is supported via the payment of tuition and fees by the graduate student body, BE IT
THEREFORE
- ENACTED:** That the PAG committee will not allocate funds for travel and research to those graduate students who are classified under "continuous registration", and BE IT
FURTHER
- ENACTED:** That it is the responsibility of the PAG committee chair, in conjunction with the appropriate Graduate College personnel (i.e.-Sandy Jensen), to enforce this policy.
